Welcome to the 2018 and 24th Positive Images Festival programme, which this year runs from Saturday 16th June to 7th July. To celebrate Coventry being named UK City of Culture 2021, Positive Images will run a number of events and projects throughout July and August, culminating on 12th September, with a special performance by one of Britain's best known poets, Ian McMillan. We continue to support other communities and organisations' events where we can and this year the support will go to Canley Popup Café, Hillfields Festival and the Spon Spun Festival amongst others. Arts Council, Awards for All and in particular the invaluable in-kind funding we have received through the Home Office's Building a Stronger Britain Together (BSBT), which has provided the new website www.positiveimagesfestival.co.uk, an E-newsletter, publicity materials and training support.

One of our most significant partners is Hillz FM and we work closely with this fantastic community radio station, who will again be involved - managing the stage at the Festival Launch, talking to people attending the Launch performances and posting up their comments and opinions.

As ever, we work alongside many other community events during the summer months including Coventry Pride which takes place the week before the Festival Launch, as well as Refugee Week, the Hillfields Festival, the Canley Community Festival and the Spon Spun Festival.

We hope to have some of the Godiva Sisters along on the day, which will also see the Craft and Food Fair and an afternoon of entertainment from musicians and dancers representing all our communities.
